Early Years Literacy

This semester, Forrest Primary School staff are a part of the Early Years Literacy (EYL) initiative. The EYL initiative has been designed to impact early years (P-2) literacy learning through improving the implementation of early years literacy practices and developing leadership knowledge and capacity. The initiative has been designed to support the implementation of 10 essential instructional practices in early years literacy. Staff at Forrest Primary School will participate in a series of workshops and masterclasses across the semester and utilise this knowledge in everyday teaching to support improved literacy outcomes.

PANL

Last Tuesday and Wednesday, Hayley Munsie (nee Singh), Sarah Bauer and Ruqayyah Omari attended a PANL workshop which focused on developing a whole school approach to problem solving and word problems in Mathematics, led by Paul Swan and David Dunstan. During this two-day course, participants were given a range of support documents for developing a coherent approach to problem solving in Mathematics. The workshop consisted of several elements targeting mathematical literacy and what is required when solving a problem. Practical advice and 'hands-on' support materials were provided to set us on the path to a coherent approach to problem solving across the school. Some reference was made to NAPLAN as a source of word problems. By providing staff with the opportunity to attend this workshop, Forrest Primary School aims to take on board the information, data and resources gathered to support teachers in classrooms.


Forrest Primary School offers home reading support to parents who speak a language other than English. We will give you tips on how to support your child's reading at home.
